OBJECTIVES

This project aims to strengthen multisectoral governance, crisis management, policy advocacy, and strategic leadership among senior health and environment professionals.

BENEFICIARIES

40 senior and mid-level professionals from MoPHP, MoAIF, MoWE and other relevant institutions engaged in emergency preparedness, outbreak coordination, and One Health implementation in Yemen.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

An intensive 5-day, in-person training workshop for 40 officials from key ministries (MoPHP, MoAIF, MoWE) and emergency sectors. The workshop utilizes group work and mock inter-ministerial coordination drills, culminating in a tailored One Health Action Plan for each participant's institution.

PROJECT PHASES

This project consists of three main phases:

1. **Preparation:** Material development, Arabic translation, Adaptation, and Contextualization of the training curriculum.
2. **Implementation:** Delivery of the 5-day interactive training workshop.
3. **Reporting:** Compilation of a comprehensive final report detailing learning gains (pre-/post-tests) and institutional recommendations.

Currently . . .

Initiating multisectoral content development and localization to directly counter Yemen's fragmented, sector-specific training models. Current focus is on embedding localized, complex humanitarian context data into the curriculum to bridge the traditional divides between human, animal, and environmental ministries.

What's next . . .

Driving operational policy translation to shift senior leadership from a reactive posture to proactive, cross-sectoral governance. By utilizing interactive simulations, this step forces collaborative decision-making across ministries, resulting in institutionalized One Health Action Plans designed to systematically mitigate systemic public health vulnerabilities.
